## CJLR-FM La Ronge and its transmitter CJLR-FM-3 Prince Albert – Technical change

- 1. The Commission **approves** the application by Natotawin Broadcasting Inc. (Natotawin) to change the authorized contours of its transmitter CJLR-FM-3 Prince Albert, by increasing the effective radiated power from 50 watts to 249 watts, and by decreasing the antenna height from 40 metres to 21 metres.
- 2. The Commission received one intervention in support of this application.
- 3. As a result of the technical amendments approved in this decision, CJLR-FM-3's status will change from that of a low-power unprotected service to a regular class A1 FM station.
- 4. The Department of Industry (the Department) has advised the Commission that, while this application is conditionally technically acceptable, it will only issue a broadcasting certificate when it has determined that the proposed technical parameters will not create any unacceptable interference with aeronautical NAV/COM services.
- 5. The Commission reminds the licensee that, pursuant to section 22(1) of the *Broadcasting Act*, this authority will only be effective when the Department notifies the Commission that its technical requirements have been met, and that a broadcasting certificate will be issued.
