## **Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2007-16**

# Patrick Keeffe, on behalf of a corporation to be incorporated Across Canada

Application 2006-0405-0 Public Hearing at Regina, Saskatchewan 30 October 2006

### RSC1 - Category 2 specialty service

In this decision, the Commission **approves** an application for a broadcasting licence to operate a new Category 2 specialty programming undertaking.

## The application

- 1. The Commission received an application by Patrick Keeffe, on behalf of a corporation to be incorporated, for a broadcasting licence to operate a national, ethnic Category 2<sup>1</sup> specialty programming undertaking to be known as RSC1.
- 2. The applicant proposed to offer a third-language, general interest service that would be devoted to the Romanian-speaking community, consisting of entertainment, sport, music, documentaries, Romanian series, news and talk shows. The applicant proposed to broadcast all of its programming in the Romanian language.
- 3. All of the programming would be drawn from the following categories set out in item 6 of Schedule I to the *Specialty Services Regulations*, 1990: 1 News; 2(a) Analysis and interpretation; 3 Reporting and actualities; 5(b) Informal education/Recreation and leisure; 6(b) Amateur sports; 7(c) Specials, mini-series or made-for-TV feature films; 7(f) Programs of comedy sketches, improvisations, unscripted works, stand-up comedy; 8(b) Music video clips; 8(c) Music video programs; 9 Variety; 10 Game shows; and 11 General entertainment and human interest.
- 4. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.

### Commission's analysis and determinations

5. The Commission is satisfied that the application is in conformity with all applicable terms and conditions announced in *Introductory statement – Licensing of new digital pay and specialty services – Corrected Appendix 2*, Public Notice CRTC 2000-171-1, 6 March 2001 (Public Notice 2000-171-1). Furthermore, given that the service will offer




more than 90% of its programming in a third language, the Commission is satisfied that the application falls under the definition of a third-language service, established in *Revised approach for the consideration of broadcasting licence applications proposing new third-language ethnic Category 2 pay and specialty services*, Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC 2005-104, 23 November 2005 (Public Notice 2005-104). Accordingly, the Commission **approves** the application by Patrick Keeffe, on behalf of a corporation to be incorporated, for a broadcasting licence to operate the national, general interest, third-language, ethnic Category 2 specialty programming undertaking, RSC1.

- 6. The Commission notes that RSC1 proposed to devote all of its program schedule to programming in the Romanian language. In accordance with Public Notice 2005-104, the Commission has imposed a **condition of licence**, as set out in the appendix to this decision that requires RSC1 to devote not less than 90% of its program schedule to programming in the Romanian language. The remainder of the program schedule, i.e., up to 10% may be in one or both official languages. The Commission encourages the applicant to ensure that all such programming serves to promote Canada's linguistic duality.
- 7. The licence will expire 31 August 2013, and will be subject to the **conditions** set out in Public Notice 2000-171-1, as well as to the **conditions** set out in the appendix to this decision.
- 8. The Commission reminds the applicant that if it wishes to enter at any given time into programming supply agreements and licence trademark agreements with non-Canadian independent producers, it must comply at all times with the *Direction to the CRTC* (*Ineligibility of non-Canadians*), P.C. 1997-486, 8 April 1997, as amended by P.C. 1998-1268, 15 July 1998 (the Direction). Accordingly, the Commission requests that the applicant file for the Commission's prior review, a copy of any programming supply agreement and/or licence trademark agreement it intends to enter into with a non-Canadian party, in order to ensure that the applicant complies at all times with the Direction.

#### Issuance of the licence

- 9. A licence will be issued once the applicant has satisfied the Commission, with supporting documentation, that the following requirements have been met:
  - an eligible Canadian corporation has been incorporated in accordance with the application in all material respects;
  - the applicant has entered into a distribution agreement with at least one licensed distributor; and



# **Appendix to Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2007-16**

#### Conditions of licence

- 1. The licence will be subject to the conditions set out in *Introductory statement Licensing of new digital pay and specialty services Corrected Appendix* 2, Public Notice CRTC 2000-171-1, 6 March 2001.
- 2. The licensee shall provide a national, general interest, third-language, ethnic Category 2 specialty programming service devoted to the Romanian-speaking community.
- 3. The programming shall be drawn exclusively from the following categories, as set out in item 6 of Schedule I to the *Specialty Services Regulations*, 1990, as amended from time to time:
  - 1 News
  - 2 (a) Analysis and interpretation
  - 3 Reporting and actualities
  - 5 (b) Informal education/Recreation and leisure
  - 6 (b) Amateur sports
  - 7 (c) Specials, mini-series or made-for-TV feature films
    - (f) Programs of comedy sketches, improvisations, unscripted works, stand-up comedy
  - 8 (b) Music video clips
    - (c) Music video programs
  - 9 Variety
  - 10 Game shows
  - 11 General entertainment and human interest
- 4. Not less than 90% of all programming broadcast during the broadcast week shall be in the Romanian language.

For the purposes of the conditions of this licence, including condition of licence no.1, *broadcast day* refers to the 24-hour period beginning each day at 6 a.m., or any other period approved by the Commission.
