Various radio programming undertakings - Licence renewals - Correction

- 1. The Commission hereby corrects *Various radio programming undertakings Licence renewals*, Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2009-525, 27 August 2009. The condition of licence 2 for the radio programming undertaking CFEL-FM Lévis/Québec (application 2009-0171-1) set out in appendix 6 to this decision should have read as follows:
 - 2. The licensee shall contribute a minimum of \$42,858 in each broadcast year to Canadian content development for a total of \$214,290. The annual contributions must be allocated as follows:
 - \$14,285 to MUSICACTION;
 - \$14,285 to Fonds RadioStar;
 - \$5,000 to Secondaire en spectacle;
 - \$5,000 to Vieux Bureau de Poste (Diffusion avant scène); and
 - \$4.288 to Diffusion culturelle de Lévis.
- 2. Also, the amounts indicated in some appendices to Broadcasting Decision 2009-525 relating to commitments to the broadcast of local news included the commitments concerning the broadcast of sports and weather. Given that the commitments noted by the Commission in its decisions generally only includes news, the Commission replaces the amounts indicated in the appendices by the following amounts:
