- 1. On 11 December 2009, the Canadian Steering Committee on Numbering (CSCN) of the CRTC Interconnection Steering Committee (CISC) submitted the following consensus report to the Commission:
 - CSCN TIF Report 82 re: TIF 75 CSCN Guidelines Review Canadian Numbering Plan & Dialling Plan, version 3, 2 December 2009 (CNRE082A)

- 3. The Commission has reviewed the above-noted consensus report and guidelines and **approves** them with the following modifications:
 - i) The last paragraph of section 3.1 (NANP Responsibilities) should be replaced with:
 - The CNAC is a company that was incorporated on June 5, 1998 under the Canada Business Corporations Act and operates under the regulatory oversight of the CRTC. The primary role of the CNAC is to administer the selection and funding of a neutral administrator who performs the functions of Canadian numbering administration for the Canadian telecommunications industry. In addition, the CNAC pays the Canadian share of the costs of the North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA). The cost of performing this function is funded by Canadian telecommunications service providers (TSPs) who benefit from numbering resources within Canada.  - ii) In the Future Dialling Plan section of Table 2 Dialling plan in each NPA, the first note at the bottom of the page "A total of 27 Geographic NPA Codes are in service (8 with 7D and 19 with 10D Local Dialling)" should be replaced with:

A total of 30 Geographic NPA Codes are in service (7 with 7D and 23 with 10D Local Dialling)
