#### **1. Montréal, Quebec** **Application No. 2010-0663-5**

Application by the **Radio communautaire francophone de Montréal inc.** relating to the broadcasting licence of the French-language Type B community radio programming undertaking CIBL-FM Montréal.

The licensee proposes to change the authorized contours by increasing the average effective radiated power (ERP) from 221 watts to 1,003 watts (maximum ERP from 293 watts to 3,000 watts with an effective height of antenna above average terrain of 192.5 metres). All other technical parameters will remain unchanged.

The licensee wishes to increase the quality of the signal of the station.

**2. Rouyn-Noranda, Quebec**  
**Application No. 2010-0811-0**

Application by the **Canadian Broadcasting Corporation** to amend the broadcasting licence of the French-language FM radio programming undertaking CHLM-FM Rouyn-Noranda.

The licensee proposes to add the transmitters CBF-1 Senneterre, CBF-3 Lebel-sur-Quévillion et CBF-4 Matagami, Quebec to rebroadcast the programs of CHLM-FM to adequately serve the population of Rouyn-Noranda.

The licensee states that this amendment will improve service to the population living within the contours of its three transmitters by giving them access to local and regional programming.

Subject to approval of this application, the licensee has also asked to amend the broadcasting licence of its French-language radio programming undertaking CBF Montréal by revoking the authority for its transmitters CBF-1 Senneterre, CBF-3 Lebel-sur-Quévillion et CBF-4 Matagami.

All the technical parameters of the rebroadcasting transmitters would remain unchanged. Only the source of the programming of the transmitters will change.

**3. Owen Sound, Ontario****Application Nos. 2010-0669-3 and 2010-0671-8**

Applications by **Bayshore Broadcasting Corporation** relating to the broadcasting licences of the English-language commercial radio programming undertakings, CIXK-FM and CKYC-FM Owen Sound.

The licensee proposes to change the authorized contours of its transmitter CIXK-FM Owen Sound by decreasing the effective radiated power from 100,000 watts to 28,000 watts (non-directional antenna), increasing the effective height of antenna above average terrain from 171.7 to 189.6 metres and moving the antenna to another site.

The licensee also proposes to change the authorized contours of its transmitter CKYC-FM Owen Sound by decreasing the effective radiated power from 31,600 watts to 22,000 watts (non-directional antenna), increasing the effective height of antenna above average terrain from 114.1 to 214 metres and moving the antenna to another site.

The licensee submits that moving its FM antennas to a new tower in Owen Sound is solely for the purpose of significantly reducing yearly operating costs associated with the maintenance of transmitter sites.

Application by **5777152 Manitoba Ltd.** for the use of frequency 107.5 MHz (channel 298A) for the operation of the new English-language commercial FM radio programming undertaking CJIE-FM Winnipeg Beach, Gimli and Arborg, Manitoba approved in *Licensing of new radio stations to serve Gimli, Winnipeg Beach and new transmitter in Arborg*, Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2010-65, 10 February 2010 (Decision 2010-65).

This application is filed in response to Decision 2010-65 in which the Commission stated that it would only issue a licence to 5777152 Manitoba Ltd. if it submitted an application proposing the use of another FM frequency that is acceptable to both the Commission and the Department of Industry.

Interventions should clearly identify the application referred to and indicate whether parties support or oppose the application, or, if they propose changes to it, include the facts and grounds for their proposal.
