NTD Television - Category 2 specialty service

The Commission approves an application for a broadcasting licence to operate a new Category 2 specialty service.

The application

- 1. New Tang Dynasty Television (Canada) (NTDT) filed an application for a broadcasting licence to operate NTD Television, a national, general interest ethnic Category 2 specialty programming undertaking that would be devoted to second generation Chinese Canadians who speak more English or French than Mandarin or Cantonese. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.
- 2. NTDT is a not-for-profit corporation controlled by its board of directors.
- 3. The applicant proposed to draw programming for the proposed service from the following program categories set out in Item 6 of Schedule I to the *Specialty Services Regulations*, 1990, as amended from time to time: 1, 2(a), 2(b), 3, 4, 5(a), 5(b), 6(a), 6(b), 7(a), 7(b), 7(c), 7(d), 7(e), 7(f), 7(g), 8(a), 8(b), 8(c), 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14.
- 4. The applicant proposed to offer 25% of its programming in high definition (HD) format and requested authority to offer both a standard definition and HD version of its service.

Commission's determination

5. The Commission is satisfied that the application complies with the frameworks set out in Public Notice 2000-6 and Broadcasting Public Notice 2008-100, with the approaches set out in Broadcasting Public Notices 2003-61 and 2006-74, and with all applicable terms and conditions set out in Public Notice 2000-171-1. Accordingly, the Commission **approves** the application by New Tang Dynasty Television (Canada) for a broadcasting licence to operate the national, general interest ethnic Category 2



specialty programming undertaking NTD Television. The terms and **conditions of licence** are set out in the appendix to this decision.

6. The Commission reminds the applicant that distribution of this service is subject to the applicable distribution rules set out in Broadcasting Public Notice 2008-100.

Appendix to Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2011-264

Terms and conditions of licence for the Category 2 specialty programming undertaking NTD Television

Terms

A licence will be issued once the applicant has satisfied the Commission, with supporting documentation, that the following requirements have been met:

- the applicant has entered into a distribution agreement with at least one licensed distributor; and
- the applicant has informed the Commission in writing that it is prepared to commence operations and has provided the Commission with a launch date for the service. The undertaking must be operational at the earliest possible date and in any event no later than 48 months from the date of this decision.

The licence will expire 31 August 2017.

Conditions of licence

- 1. The licence will be subject to the conditions set out in *Introductory statement Licensing of new digital pay and specialty services Corrected Appendix* 2, Public Notice CRTC 2000-171-1, 6 March 2001.
- 2. The licence will be subject to the conditions set out in *Implementation of the Accessibility Policy with respect to Category 2 pay and specialty services*, Broadcasting Regulatory Policy CRTC 2010-355, 8 June 2010.
- 3. The licensee shall provide a national, general interest ethnic Category 2 specialty programming service devoted to second generation Chinese Canadians who speak more English or French than Mandarin or Cantonese.
- 4. The programming shall be drawn exclusively from the following program categories set out in Item 6 of Schedule I to the *Specialty Services Regulations*, 1990, as amended from time to time:
 - 1 News
 - 2 (a) Analysis and interpretation
 - (b) Long-form documentary
 - 3 Reporting and actualities
 - 4 Religion
 - 5 (a) Formal education and pre-school
 - (b) Informal education/Recreation and leisure
 - 6 (a) Professional sports
 - (b) Amateur sports
 - 7 Drama and comedy

- (a) Ongoing dramatic series
- (b) Ongoing comedy series (sitcoms)
- (c) Specials, mini-series or made-for-TV feature films
- (d) Theatrical feature films aired on TV
- (e) Animated television programs and films
- (f) Programs of comedy sketches, improvisation, unscripted works, stand-up comedy
- (g) Other drama
- 8 (a) Music and dance other than music video programs or clips
 - (b) Music video clips
 - (c) Music video programs
- 9 Variety
- 10 Game shows
- 11 General entertainment and human interest
- 12 Interstitials
- 13 Public service announcements
- 14 Infomercials, promotional and corporate videos
- 5. In order to ensure that the licensee complies at all times with the *Direction to the CRTC (Ineligibility of non-Canadians)*, P.C. 1997-486, 8 April 1997, as amended by P.C. 1998-1268, 15 July 1998, the licensee shall file, for the Commission's prior review, a copy of any programming supply agreement and/or licence trademark agreement it intends to enter into with a non-Canadian party.
- 6. Where the licensee broadcasts religious programming as defined in *Religious Broadcasting Policy*, Public Notice CRTC 1993-78, 3 June 1993, the licensee shall adhere to the guidelines set out in sections III.B.2.a) and IV of that public notice with respect to the provision of balance and ethics in religious programming, as amended from time to time.
- 7. The licensee is authorized to make available for distribution a version of its service in high definition (HD) format, provided that not less than 95% of the video and audio components of the upgraded and standard definition versions of the service are the same, exclusive of commercial messages and of any part of the service carried on a subsidiary signal. Further, all of the programming making up the 5% allowance shall be provided in HD.

For the purposes of the conditions of this licence, including condition of licence 1, *broadcast day* refers to the 24-hour period beginning each day at 6 a.m. or any other period approved by the Commission.
