APTN is pleased to provide this report and attestation letter in accordance with our conditions of license, as set out in broadcasting decision CRTC 2013 – 383.

As per condition of licence # 10, APTN attests that it has broadcast the following Aboriginal language, French language, English language and closed captioned programming during the broadcast year ending August 31, 2018.

- APTN broadcast an average of 23.36 hours per week of French language programming and 1215 hours annually (between the hours of 06:00 06:00). This is based on the East feed. 100% of this content was closed captioned.
- APTN broadcast an average of 49.5 hours per week of Aboriginal language programming (between the hours of 06:00 – 06:00). This is based on the North feed.
- APTN broadcast approximately 6845 hours of English language programming annually (between the hours of 06:00 – 06:00), 100% of which was closed captioned.



APTN further attests that it has complied with condition of licence # 6 relating to advertising material.

APTN abides by the 12 minutes per hour of paid advertising.

As per condition #11, once again APTN is pleased to report on our independent production activity detailing the name of production, production company, whether it is "related", region, length in episodes and running time, and budget of production (in confidence).
