### CBU-FM Vancouver – New transmitter in Yellowknife

1. The Commission **approves** the application by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation to amend the broadcasting licence for the radio programming undertaking CBU-FM Vancouver, in order to operate a transmitter in Yellowknife to rebroadcast the programming of its national English-language network service Radio Two.
2. The new transmitter will operate at 95.3 MHz (channel 237A1) with an effective radiated power of 114 watts.
3. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.
4. The Yellowknife Rebroadcasting Society (The Society) is currently the licensee of a radiocommunication distribution undertaking (RDU), which operates a transmitter in Yellowknife and broadcasts Radio Two originating from CBU-FM Vancouver. In *Revocation of licence*, Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2005-232, also released today, the Commission has revoked the broadcasting licence for this RDU, as requested by The Society.
