## Aliant Telecom Inc.

Reference: Tariff Notice 191

## Ex parte application

- 1. The Commission **approves on an interim basis**, effective 6 March 2006, the *ex parte* application<sup>1</sup> by Aliant Telecom Inc., dated 1 February 2006.
- 2. In order that the application may be available for public examination consistent with the *CRTC Telecommunications Rules of Procedure* (the Rules), the company is directed to file with the Commission at procedure@crtc.gc.ca, on or before 6 March 2006, an electronic version of the application<sup>2</sup> for the Commission web site. Among other things, the Rules and Telecom Circular CRTC 2005-9 allow interveners to comment, within 25 days, on tariff applications that have been placed on the public record.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> An *ex parte* application is an application that has been filed with the Commission without notice to the public and, as such, is not placed on the public record when initially filed. An *ex parte* decision is one in which the Commission disposes of an application solely on the basis of the applicant's submissions. Subsection 61(3) of the *Telecommunications Act* allows the Commission to make an *ex parte* decision where it considers that the circumstances of the case justify it. In *Review of regulatory framework*, Telecom Decision CRTC 94-19, 16 September 1994, the Commission set out several considerations to be balanced in any determination to permit *ex parte* tariff filings, including the public interest in the effective operation of the competitive marketplace and the public interest in an open regulatory process.
