



## Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC 2007-30

Application by **King's Kids Promotions Outreach Ministries Incorporated** (King's Kids) to amend the licence of the radio programming undertaking CKKK-FM Peterborough, Ontario.

The licensee proposes to amend the licence by changing the frequency from 99.5 MHz (channel 258LP) to 90.5 MHz (channel 213A1).

The licensee also proposes to change the authorized contours by increasing the effective radiated power from 50 watts to 230 watts, by increasing the antenna height and by relocating the transmitter (non-directional antenna/antenna height 26.4 metres).

The authorized contours of the transmitter will be increased significantly resulting from the proposed technical changes.

In Broadcasting Notice of Public Hearing CRTC 2006-11, 19 October 2006, the Commission announced an application by CHUM Limited (CHUM) to convert its AM station, CKPT Peterborough, to the FM band operating on the frequency 99.3 MHz (channel 257B). This application has been approved in Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2007-99 issued today.

Consequently, King's Kids which operates as a low-power unprotected station on 99.5 MHz (channel 258LP), which is the first adjacent frequency to CHUM's new station frequency at 99.3 MHz, has filed this application.

The Commission notes that the increase in power would change the status of CKKK-FM Peterborough from an unprotected low-power service to a regular Class A1 service.
