VOAR Mount Pearl and its transmitters – Licence renewal

1. The Commission **renews** the broadcasting licence for the English-language religious AM radio programming undertaking VOAR Mount Pearl and its transmitters VOAR-1-FM Bay Roberts, VOAR-2-FM Marystown, VOAR-3-FM Lewisporte, VOAR-4-FM Gander, VOAR-5-FM Deer Lake, VOAR-6-FM Botwood, VOAR-7-FM Springdale, VOAR-8-FM Grand Falls, VOAR-9-FM Corner Brook, VOAR-10-FM Port aux Basques, VOAR-11-FM Goose Bay and VOAR-12-FM Wabush from 1 January 2009 to 31 August 2015.¹
2. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.
3. The licence will be subject to the **conditions** specified therein and to the following **conditions**:

If the licensee originates 42 or more hours of programming in any broadcast week, the licensee shall adhere to the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' *Equitable Portrayal Code*, as amended from time to time and approved by the Commission. However, the application of the foregoing condition of licence will be suspended if the licensee is a member in good standing of the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council.

The licensee shall adhere to the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' *Broadcast Code for Advertising to Children*, as amended from time to time and approved by the Commission.

¹ In *Administrative renewals*, Broadcasting Decision 2008-245, 29 August 2008, the Commission administratively renewed the licence for VOAR Mount Pearl and its transmitters from 1 September 2008 to 31 December 2008.

4. In accordance with *Implementation of an employment equity policy*, Public Notice CRTC 1992-59, 1 September 1992, the Commission encourages the licensee to consider employment equity issues in its hiring practices and in all other aspects of its management of human resources.
