### Various commercial radio programming undertakings – Licence renewals

1. The Commission **renews** the broadcasting licences for the commercial radio programming undertakings set out in the table below from 1 January 2014<sup>1</sup> to 31 August 2020. In each case, the licensee shall adhere to the **conditions of licence** set out in Broadcasting Regulatory Policy 2009-62, as amended from time to time.

2. The Commission received an intervention commenting on these applications, submitted on behalf of the province of British Columbia, relating to the participation of these stations in the National Public Alerting System (NPAS) in their jurisdiction. The public record for this proceeding can be found on the Commission's website at [www.crtc.gc.ca](http://www.crtc.gc.ca) under "Public Proceedings."
3. As specified in its three-year plan, the Commission will be looking at measures to ensure the participation of Canadian broadcasters and telecommunications service providers in the NPAS. Therefore, the Commission will not impose conditions of licence requiring the participation of broadcasters in the NPAS at this time. However, the Commission expects all licensees to voluntarily participate in the NPAS so that Canadians receive timely warnings of imminent perils.
4. In Broadcasting Decision 2010-433, the Commission renewed the licence of CKDV-FM Prince George and its transmitter CKMK Mackenzie for a short-term period of three years, given the station's non-compliance with its condition of licence relating to Canadian talent development contributions for the 2004-2005 broadcast year. The Commission notes that the non-compliance issues have been resolved. In addition, the Commission notes that in the last licence term, the licensee was in compliance with its regulatory requirements.

## **Reminders**

5. The Commission reminds the licensee that it must fulfill the commitments set out in Broadcasting Decision 2006-639 relating to the acquisition of CKKQ-FM Victoria and its transmitter CKKQ-FM-1 Sooke and CJZN-FM Victoria and its transmitter CKXM-FM-1 Sooke (now CJZN-FM-1) from O.K. Radio Group.
6. Pursuant to section 22 of the *Broadcasting Act*, the Commission reminds the licensee that the broadcasting licences will cease to have any force or effect if the broadcasting certificates issued by the Department of Industry lapse.

## **Employment equity**

7. Because the licensee is subject to the *Employment Equity Act* and files reports concerning employment equity with the Department of Human Resources and Skills Development, its employment equity practices are not examined by the Commission.
